**About the Fellowship**

- Started in 2011 with an initial class of five Fellows, the Fellowship admits 20-25 Fellows each year.
- The Fellowship is intended to be a **two-year program**, with the second year contingent on satisfactory performance and availability of funds.
- Though the Fellowship has grown dramatically in just a few years, the Fellowship remains **highly competitive**, with only about 10% of applicants being selected for the Evaluation Fellowship Program.
- Many professional and social activities are available to support networking and build camaraderie in the cohort.



**About the CDC Evaluation Fellows**

- **Experience:** Fellows are PhD or master's degree professionals with backgrounds in evaluation, behavioral and social sciences, public health, and other disciplines relevant to CDC's work. Successful applicants also typically have significant experience in applied evaluation projects.
- **Placement:** Fellows are based in Atlanta, Georgia working within one of CDC's programs.
- **Funding:** Fellows receive a monthly stipend depending on education level and experience and, unlike many fellowships, CDC Evaluation Fellows receive substantial financial support for their training and professional development, as well as a supplement to offset health insurance costs.



**Applying for the Fellowship**

- Candidates must have received their qualifying degree within the past five years.
- **Qualifying degree must be completed by end of Spring semester of the year candidate is applying and on transcript by June.**
- The CDC Evaluation Fellowship Program is a training fellowship through the **Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education (ORISE)**, so Fellows do not become employees of CDC.
- Some non-U.S. citizens are eligible to apply. For more information, see the **ORISE Guidelines for Non-U.S. Citizens**.
- The 2019 application deadline is Monday April 8, 2019 at 1 pm EST. See our web site at [www.cdc.gov/eval/fellowship](http://www.cdc.gov/eval/fellowship) for application and details. Fellows begin their fellowship **in Atlanta** in mid-August.
